During her tenure as the garden editor for *House & Garden* magazine for 9 years, from

October 1998 until its closing in 2007, she travelled the world to bring brilliant garden designs to the more than one million subscribers. She is also the Contributing Editor at *Town & Country* magazine. Her passion for both writing and landscape architecture has contributed to her most recent book, called *Private Paradise: Contemporary American Gardens*, published in 2011. She has authored *The Zone Garden*, a series of three books: (1) *A Surefire Guide to Gardening in Zones 3, 4, and 5*; (2) *Zones 5, 6, and 7*; (3) and *Zones 8, 9, and 10*. Her articles have appeared in such publications as *House & Garden, Town & Country, New England Monthly, Connoisseur, Architectural Record*, and the *Providence Journal*.

Audiences have listened to her lectures on the subject of gardens and garden design on board the Queen Mary 2, and at seminars, gardens clubs and institutions across the U.S., including the Detroit Institute of Art, The Fort Lauderdale Museum of Art, The New York Botanical Garden, and the Seattle Horticultural Society. She was one of the two American judges at the prestigious 1994 and 2001 Paris Rose Trials at Bagatelle.

Charlotte Frieze, hails from Malibu, California, where she lives with her husband, Peter C. Jones, who is a fine art & publication consultant, author, photographer and documentary filmmaker.

Many of our members "dug in." Alongside the garden's designer, the one and only, Ruben Flores with his crew and members of LBSC, we planted "region-specific" plants in each of the gardens.

Visiting the garden is a must. Go see it soon, while it's still in its infancy. Then, continue to stop by and watch it mature. Know it is a wonderful example of what we can accomplish together to promote beauty in our world. While you're there, feel free to garden a bit, especially by removing a few of the fallen Eucalyptus leaves.

I look forward to the new year, and all that it will bring, including the Sister City Garden ribbon cutting ceremony, hosted by LBSC. Of course, we will keep you informed and look forward to seeing you there.

For those of you who don't know, I am a Monarch Butterfly enthusiast. They are not only beautiful; they are incredibly fascinating.

Last winter, I was ecstatic that we still had Monarch Butterflies in our garden. I would tell everyone and have since learned that it is not a good thing to have Monarchs year round.

Because we have Tropical Milkweed, which can bloom all year in climates like ours, the Monarchs were able to continue to breed and feed which, unfortunately, disrupted their migration pattern.

So, in November, I had the milkweed cut down to just a few inches above ground, and I am saying good-bye to the Monarchs until next Spring.

## Recap of our MEMBER TOUR to The Huntington

On November 20, Tom Hensel once again organized a terrific day for the 34 Garden Club members who made the trek to San Marino to enjoy the beauty of what the Huntington has to offer. The Huntington consists of three major areas: the Library which houses rare books and manuscripts for qualified scholars and researchers to use (such as Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales*, a *Gutenberg Bible* on vellum, Audubon's *Birds of America*, and a world-class collection of Shakespeare's plays); the Art Gallery housed in the mansion with three main galleries displays Gainsborough's "Blue Boy", Lawrence's "Pinkie", and works by Mary Cassatt and Edward Hopper; and of course the Botanical Gardens. The gardens take up 120 acres on the estate left by railroad baron Henry Huntington and his wife Arabella. There are 8 different gardens: Desert, Japanese, Chinese, Subtropical, Herb, Jungle, Palm, and the stellar Rose Garden. The gardens not only display incredible rare specimens but statuary, beautiful trellis work and structures indigenous to each area. The Teaching Greenhouse arboretum is used to educate more than 12,000 children yearly, ages ranging from pre-school to high school.

Tom Carruth, the rose curator at the Huntington who spoke at our October meeting, took us on a private tour of the Rose Garden and surrounding areas. I felt privileged to see his transforming work in the garden in action. Then many of us took advantage of the hourly docent tours, which ours lasted more than one hour, to get a general overview of what is available to see in the Botanical Gardens. The last hour or so we were on our own to absorb as much as we could of this vast estate. Many of us then met in old, downtown Pasadena to eat at Cafe Santorini before heading home to arrive just prior to the rain that night.

An overnight trip would be the best use of travel time to enable any visitor to see all that the Huntington has to offer. I am definitely returning with my husband in the Spring.

Thank You Tom for this spectacular day.


