Teena Spindler & Kay Havens

Masterfully Planning a Botanical Garden in the Great Park

e are excited to have as our first speakers of the year, a dynamic duo of Master Gardeners who are instrumental in the blossoming of the Great Park Botanical Garden in Irvine.

Teena Spindler (top photo) and **Kay Havens** (bottom photo) are founders of the *Great Park*





Garden Coalition (GPGC), whose purpose is to support the creation of a Botanical Garden at the Great Park, in Irvine (former site of the El Toro Marine Corps Air Station). They will share the story of the grass roots journey that began in 2017 with a handful of Master

Gardeners determined to have a botanical garden retained in the Orange County Great Park Master Plan The vision of a world-class botanical garden inspired more than a thousand supporters, and as a result the City of Irvine identified a site for the garden. Over 30 creative designs for the Botanical Garden were submitted by students in Cal Poly Pomona's Landscape Architecture program. The Orange County Great Park consists of 1,300 acres, of which 59 acres is preserved for the botanical garden and ensures that the land is safe from redesignation. The GPGC's ultimate mission is to envision, inspire, protect, and guide thoughtful leaders in creating and building a world-class destination garden for generations to come.

Teena and Kay are both longtime Master Gardeners. Teena is life-long garden lover and ioined the ranks of UCCE Master Gardener in 2006 and lead Master Gardener volunteers to create the Farm + Food Lab garden at the Orange County Great Park in partnership with City of Irvine. Kay also is an avid lifetime gardener and garden designer. As an UCCE Master Gardener since 2007, she helped initiate the apex educational programs that won top State and International Master Gardener

awards. They both look forward to the day when we all can walk through the gates of a "growing legacy" of the botanical garden that the Great Park Garden Coalition plans to bring to reality. Their vision is to have a botanical garden "bloom right here in Orange County."

Since March many of us have taken several walks in our neighborhoods, varying the streets and destinations. If you'd like to see new places, go to www.publicgardens.org to the "Garden Map" tab, then fill in the "Search Public Gardens" and Viola, a map of 28 public and participating gardens within 150 miles will appear.

Visiting such gardens is not only good for the spirit; it's also good for the gardener's imagination. Gardening is has become more popular during the pandemic, any trip the local nurseries will attest. Focusing on local gardens showcases what grows best in our community. Local botanical gardens can also help quench a thirst for travel when long distance travel is limited.

We're looking forward to "seeing" you on Zoom on September 11.

Friday, September 11, 2020

Teena Spindler & Kay Havens – Creating a Legacy: The Great Park Botanical Garden:

The City of Irvine identified a 59-acre site at the Great Park (the former Marine Corps Air Station El Toro) as a Botanical Garden and accepted over 30 creative designs by Cal Poly Pomona Landscape Architecture program in May of 2020. Teena and Kay are long time UCCE Master Gardeners and instrumental in creating the Great Park Garden Coalition to build a world-class garden for generations to come.





Friday, October 9, 2020

Dr. Matt Ritter – Trees of Southern California:

Dr. Ritter, a professor of Biology at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and author of *A California's Guide to the Trees Among Us*, will guide us through the urban forest. Matt will cultivate our curiosity and wonder about the green world around us as he does for his hundreds of university students each year.

Susie Vanderlip – Everything You Ever Wanted to Know about Monarch Butterflies: Enjoy 45-60 minutes of science-based information on monarch butterfly life cycle, butterfly gardening, milkweeds, migration and more told through engaging live videos, beautiful photos, and fun anecdotes from a monarch butterfly "Midwife," Susie Vanderlip.

Corey Welles – Sustainable Organic Gardening:

Corey will share organic methods employed by Lotusland in Santa Barbara. Corey has developed strategies for Lotusland to deal with common garden pests (ants, snails, slugs, gophers, aphids). In addition, discover how to care for popular plants using a "green" approach, including lawns, fruit trees, roses, and palms, along with natural weed management techniques.

Anna Maria Desipris — Garden Pollinators — Native and Honey Bees: Local bee guardian and educator will present on some of our favorite pollinators: honeybees and our beloved native bees. 
