Kelly Griffin **Succulents Around the World**

elly Griffin travels the world looking for weirdos. He visits remote and exotic locations looking for plants with spots or bumps or strips or funny thorns and (legally) takes home samples to use in his lab to hybridize new succulents. He will be bringing some of his newest creations to the meeting May 12 for us to drool over and buy.

Griffin is a succulent plant hybridizer, propagator, and avid plant explorer whose interest in plants, in particular succulents, started at a young age. He has traveled the world and visited more than 20 countries in search of spectacular succulents. Five trips to Madagascar, five trips to South Africa, and more than 25 trips to Mexico have

yielded tissue samples that he uses to create hybrids. Kelly is responsible for over 100 succulent hybrids, including Aloes, Agaves, and Echeverias. He is particularly well-known for his Aloe hybrids which are 30 years in the making – Pink Blush, Delta Lights, Christmas Sleigh, to name a few. And for his Agave hybrids such as - Blue Glow, Snow Glow, Cubic, Dragon Toes, Spawn, Black and Blue and Crème Brulé. Griffin is also responsible for obtaining and propagating seeds from many interesting species now


















Earth Day - Suzee Ramirez Paying It Forward

I ight members of the Garden Club led crafts at the Earth Day event at Roots Academy, a charter school ✓ in Laguna Niguel. Upon arrival we walked through a lovely new garden of natives with a dry stream and stepping stones. Later I learned the garden was designed by Suzee Ramirez of Urban Ecology Studio. If the name sounds familiar, she was a student at Saddleback when we awarded her a scholarship in 2020 which she used to buy a new laptop.

She went back to school in 2018 to take permaculture and urban farming courses. She had been volunteering at the Ecology Center and really enjoyed it and wanted to learn more about the field. During her first semester at Saddleback she met a lot of great people of all ages and cultures -- and wanted to continue her studies. Her professors and fellow



students were very encouraging - and her background in graphic design was a great boost. She went on to obtain certificates in Sustainable Landscape Design (2021) and Sustainable Horticulture (2022).

Suzee met two other women (Dana Martin & Farah Saquib) who were interested in making a career out of their studies and had the same ecological philosophy about landscape design possibilities. They decided to form a business after working on a few projects together. At first, they were doing only design and consultation. Suzee got her contractor's license in the beginning of '22 and they made the leap into building their projects.

Suzee is currently working towards the Environmental Restoration Certificate at Saddleback. Suzee's driving passion is the natural - more untouched - world. She would love to continue to explore how residential and other urban settings can bring in more elements of the natural world to create habitat corridors for wildlife. I'm so proud our club gave a little support to a woman who is now doing so much to support the planet.

n Saturday, April 22, eight Garden Club members spent an afternoon at the Community Root Academy in Laguna Niguel, lending our support for this event on a very warm afternoon. Our booth offered free seed packets of so many varieties, had rock painting for everyone and many little ones had fun, gave advice on planting, discussed the benefits of joining the Laguna Beach Garden Club, and promoted the upcoming Gate & Garden Tour.
