Guests were greeted at the entrance by the newly commissioned "Good of the Hive" mural by Matt Willey. It was wonderful to see the smiles spread across the faces of guests as they saw the mural for the first time.

The weather the last few weeks created lush gardens but on tour day the skies withheld their rain long enough for tour guests to thoroughly enjoy the day. The excitement in













the air was palpable as guest waited to board the VIP buses that would whisk them to the undisclosed garden location. This year's gardens were curated with great care to provide an easy walk for guests while providing a delightful variety of garden styles to inspire all who attended. From the spectacular Asian Garden number 1, to the fun of Garden 4, which was also the Waterwise winner, to the cool Zen of Garden number 8 and all in between, each garden was special.

The volunteers were most gracious and kind, which was noted by guests and added to the warmth and hospitality that our club is known for, and draws members to us like bees to a hive!










Busy Worker Bees at the April Meeting

Mayor Kempf Proclaims Laguna Beach Bee Day -The first Saturday in May -Tour Day!

hen the Laguna Beach Garden Club Board began to develop their strategic vision for what was the most impactful thing they could do as an organization for our community, we were immediately drawn to protecting pollinators. It was right up our alley. We were already helping to educate people on being conscious about choosing earth friendly, water conscious planting, and avoiding pesticides, fungicides or herbicides in your gardens.



Then the beautiful mural came into our sights and with your help we were able to make that happen. Then **Blair Contratto** challenged me to make sure that the mural 'had legs' and breath of impact for

getting the message out over time. I was immediately intrigued about how we as a small community club could do that. As I read about the great work the United Nations did trying to tackle this issue on a far greater scale, I landed on having a "Laguna Beach Bee Day". The goal being that we educate, inform and give practical suggestions on a day when all eyes are on the club.....that would be "Tour Day"! We have the eyes of over 700 guests, the media, local government and homeowners. It is the perfect platform with the help of



our incredible partners at the Laguna Beach County Water District to show our guests not only a wonderful day of strolling through gardens but practical ways to help solve global hunger by simply taking steps to save the pollinators of our planet. Using the guidelines that the UN has set forth, we integrated all their suggestions into our tour plan.

How can we do more?

Individually by:

- planting a diverse set of native plants, which flower at different times of the year
- buying raw honey from local farmers
- buying products from sustainable agricultural practices
- avoiding pesticides, fungicides or herbicides in our gardens
- protecting wild bee colonies when possible
- sponsoring a hive
- making a bee water fountain by leaving a water bowl outside
- helping sustaining forest ecosystems
- raising awareness around us by sharing this information within our communities and networks; The decline of bees affects us all!

On tour day, we awarded a prize to a Laguna Beach High School student who has become a master beekeeper and is exemplifying what we hope the next generation will make standard. A member of Orange County Beekeepers Society sold local honey at our Ways and Means table on tour day. The Laguna Beach County Water District was on hand to give water saving and planting tips to our guests.

We are striving to emulate the seamless and smooth behavior of a hive that naturally is inclined to do the right thing because it benefits the collective. Like humans, bees are incredibly social creatures, who will protect the ones they love and will work together for common goals. It's worth remembering that we can learn plenty from them. - Karen Nelson
