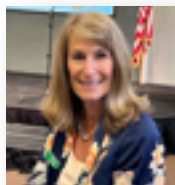

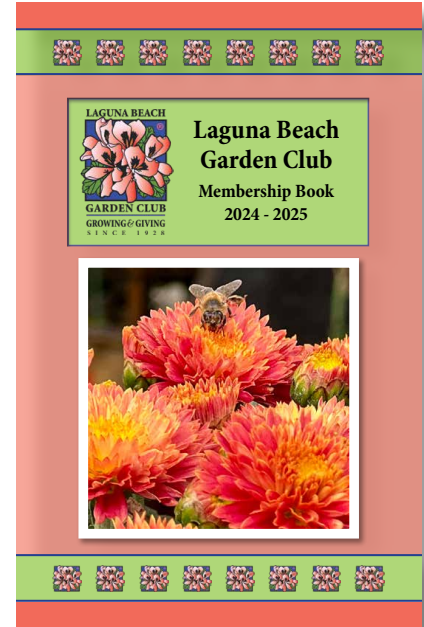
## Our Membership Climbs to 220

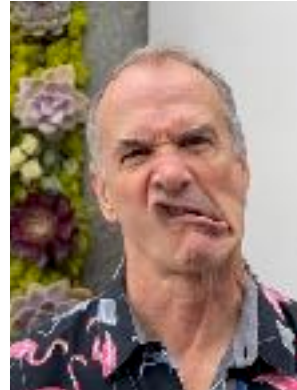

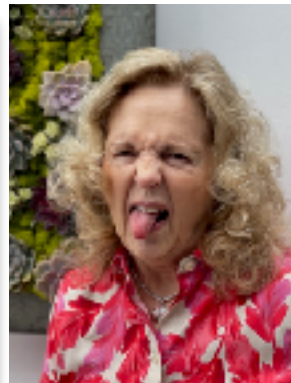
