A native of St. Louis, Hortense moved to Laguna Beach in 1953 and died in 2008 just shy of her 100th birthday. A lifelong writer, ferocious gardener and talented craftsperson, she was straightforward, unpretentious and feisty in her philosophy about gardening, politics, love and life in general. Although the property has been owned by Laguna Beach since 1977 when Hortense bequeathed it to the City, it is managed and cared for by a volunteer Board that must annually raise funds to repair and maintain the house as well as the more than 800 species of plants and trees that fill the dozens of slope side paths.

Maybe your neighbors are egg eaters, too, and you can bring theirs on Nov 8? With each one we donate we help the environment by giving them a second life and save \$0.45 for the Pantry. And it makes us feel **SO GOOD!** 

Remember to open and stack them and bring only cartons with lids, plastic or paper are both welcome. (I double checked and plastic is ok).

In addition to our monthly egg carton drive, November is our annual food drive/money drive month. Canned goods such as peanut butter, pasta sauce, canned fish, canned beans, dry pasta and beans and other vegetables are always welcome. And staples like ketchup, mustard and mayonnaise. Check the dates if you're pulling off your kitchen shelves and don't bring anything that's expired. You can also bring checks (made out to Laguna Beach Food Pantry) and cash and I will make sure these make it to the Pantry. Monetary donations are particularly welcome as the Pantry buys food wholesale making your dollars go further.

Everything we do for the Pantry is appreciated so very much by their staff and volunteers.LBGC is making a lasting impact in the lives of so many! Thank you and see you all in November 8!

I had arrived early and had 15 minutes to relax before she arrived. I was luxuriating in the beautiful weather, the gorgeous surroundings and the amiable staff at the restaurant. I thanked my lucky stars for another beautiful day in this beautiful town. I felt like I needed to pinch myself that I get to live here!

Three women were sitting at the table nearby and for 15 minutes I heard them complain about the weather, the traffic, the police, the city council, the election, their spouses, their children, their bodies, their gym, the food and on and on. The variety of offerings on this six mile nursery crawl was astonishing: from the boutique vibe of Barrels & Branches, towering fiddle leaf trees at Cordova Gardens, to the Halloween candy corn colored striped mums, and lush pots of retro spider plants and tradescantia varieties at Weidners' Gardens. Also at Weidners' were glimpses of poinsettia starts for which the nursery is known, finds like an elegant bud vase looking like it came off a page of a glossy shelter magazine, and...goats. At Cal Pacific Orchid Farm, there were unique





vessels alongside colorful blooming orchids, and a tour where we saw the bulbous growth of the 100-year-old orchid and all our orchid questions were answered. In fact from the
