A beautiful California Sycamore was added to the park which will no doubt be enjoyed by all for years to come.

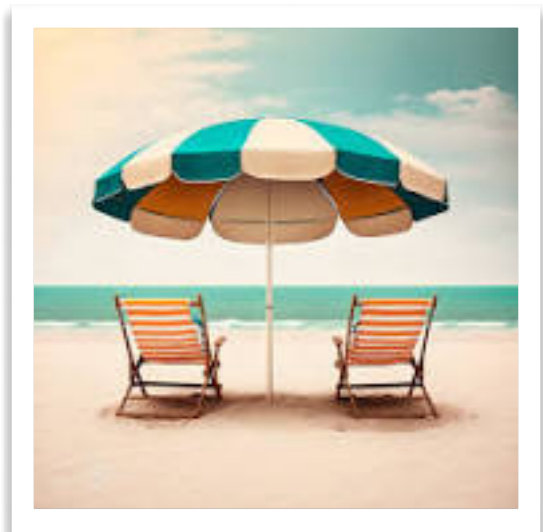
